ANNA MORRIS

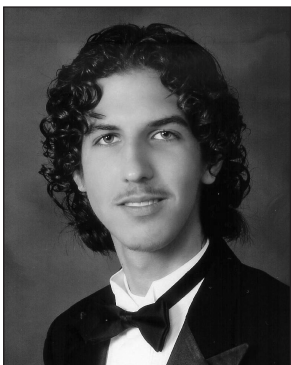
